#### **Distance Learning Discounts**

- 50% discount on MRC of Mobile Data Services purchased by Public School Districts for use by students who lack adequate internet access at home
- Limited to Rural, Small and Medium Public School Districts
- Discounts eligible April 1, 2020 though June 30, 2021
- Participating providers: AT&T Mobility, Kajeet, Sprint Spectrum, T-Mobile, US Cellular, and Verizon Wireless.
- Exempts schools from two CTF rules:
  - off-campus services are typically ineligible
  - Imputation of statewide average E-Rate support





#### **Distance Learning Discounts**

- Approved discounts for over 100,000 connections for purchase by 412 public school districts
- Number of connections average = 30 percent of daily attendance
- Provide discount on approx. 30,000 connections
- MRC before discount = \$10 to \$40 per connection
- Average Discount = \$5 to \$20 per connection
- Total Distance Learning Discounts = \$370,000 per month





#### March 2, 2021 - Ex-Parte Letter to FCC re: E-Rate Funds for Remote Learning

- From CPUC President Batjer and Commissioner Guzman-Aceves
- Shared data and takeaways from CTF Distance Learning Discounts
- Encourage the FCC to consider retroactively expanding E-Rate eligibility to at least July 1, 2020
- One size does not fit all: Schools need choice of Provider & Tech & Service
- Support expansion of E-Rate eligibility to include off-campus use of connections and devices
- Revise concepts of "classroom" and "campus" to include distance learning
- Prioritize low-income schools, particularly students lacking home broadband
- Support flexibility filing requirements and schedules





#### April 9, 2021 - CPUC submits comments to FCC re: \$7 billion Emergency Connectivity Fund

- Reiterate suggestions from March 2, 2021 Ex Parte Letter
- Expand the E-Rate program to support remote learning
- Ensure funding benefits Tribal areas
- Allow retroactive reimbursements
- Oppose proposal to exclude services and equipment that received state funding for remote learning
