**PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY'S (U 39 G) RESPONSE TO
ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE'S RULING SEEKING REVISED DATA
FROM CALIFORNIA'S GAS UTILITIES
(PUBLIC VERSION)**

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Pacific Gas and Electric Company (“PG&E”) respectfully provides its Response to the Administrative Law Judge’s Ruling Seeking Revised Data from California’s Gas Utilities, issued on September 21, 2022 (Ruling).¹ PG&E’s Response to the Ruling consists of the following attachments, which are available through the accompanying Notice of Availability:

- 1) Attachment A to this Response provides the additional information requested in the Ruling at Appendix A.1 (Risk Assessment Methods), including a summary of PG&E’s Distribution Integrity Management Program (DIMP) procedure and risk assessment methodology;
- 2) Attachment A to the Response also provides the additional information requested in the Ruling at Appendix A.2 (2021 PHMSA Distribution Pipeline Mileage and Repairs Report);

- 3) Attachment B to this Response provides corrections and updates to the information provided in PG&E's May 20, 2022 Response, as well as additional information, as directed in the Ruling at Appendix B (Utility-Specific). Attachment B contains the information requested in the Ruling to the extent the information is available in PG&E's data systems.² Also, where applicable PG&E has stated updated assumptions in Attachment B that it made in providing the information requested in the Ruling. Attachment B is provided in PDF format solely for the record of this proceeding. Due to the size of the data fields and the amount of data provided, PG&E recommends that parties view the data contained in PG&E's Response using the website pathway described in PG&E's accompanying Notice of Availability.
- 4) Contemporaneously with this Response, PG&E is filing a Motion for Leave to File Under Seal Confidential Materials Filed in Response to Administrative Law Judge's Ruling Seeking Revised Data from California's Gas Utilities (Motion). The confidential customer gas consumption data information described in the Motion, consistent with the Administrative Law Judge's Ruling on Gas Utilities' Confidentiality Claims Concerning Customer Gas Consumption and Infrastructure Data and Order Requiring Resubmission of Data, issued on October 28, 2022, is in Attachment B only and has been redacted from the public version of PG&E's Response.
