

Hello,

Pursuant to Cal. Gov't Code Section 6250 et seq ("The California Open Records Act" or "CORA"), I hereby request that I be allowed immediate access to, or in the alternative, copies of all correspondence, including but not limited to letters, emails, and minutes of phone calls between representatives of Sempra Energy's Southern California Gas Company and the California Public Utilities Commission regarding the Aliso Canyon natural gas leak that was detected on October 23.

I am a reporter for Bloomberg News, an accredited and recognized newsgathering organization, and request the Records in order to inform the public about matters of public concern.

I am further requesting that the Records be provided to me on computer files in the same format as they are currently maintained at the California Public Utilities Commission, pursuant to Section 6254.9(d) of the CORA.

Because the California Public Utilities Commission is a governmental entity within the definitions set forth by the above-referenced statute, pursuant to Sections 6253(b) and (c) of the CORA, please state in writing within 10 (ten) days of this letter any legal basis you may assert for refusing to so disclose or deciding to redact any information from the Records. See also Section 6255(a), (requiring prompt notification of denial including legal reasoning upon which denial is based).

Pursuant to the Section 6253(b) of the CORA we agree to pay reasonable fees for the Records, including actual costs up to \$250. If you choose to make the Records available but your estimate is that actual costs will exceed this amount, please contact me so that I may make the appropriate arrangements for payment. Please contact me if I may expedite your office's satisfaction of its obligations under the CORA.
