PG&E remains committed to being open, transparent and fully cooperative throughout this process. As a reflection of our continued commitment, PG&E supports Commission staff publicly posting the 20 Day Reports related to the October 2017 Northern California Wildfires under these circumstances.

The Commission's Legal Division has stated that, for a limited period of time, specific street addresses and circuit and pole identifying numbers will be redacted from the Electric Incident Reports that are publicly posted (Mr. Harris' Letter dated October 27, 2017). As stated in Mr. Harris' Letter, "this limited period will end when CAL FIRE, and the Commission's Safety and Enforcement Division, informs the Legal Division Public Records Office that the portions of investigations that involve the collection of evidence and the initial review of the reported incident locations have been completed, and that there is no longer a serious risk that the integrity of the evidence and data collection process would be seriously compromised by the disclosure of street addresses, and circuit and pole identifying information." PG&E requests that the same approach be taken for any 20 Day Reports relating to the October 2017 Northern California Wildfires that are publicly posted.
