Safety and Emergency Information

Public Comment

- Per Resolution ALJ-252, any member of the public (excluding parties and their representatives) who wishes to address the CPUC about matters before the Commission must sign up with the Public Advisor's Office table before the meeting begins. If an individual has signed up using the electronic system on the Commission's website, they must check in with the Public Advisor's Office on the day of the meeting, by the sign-up deadline.
- Once called, each speaker has up to 3 minutes at the discretion of the Commission President. Depending on the number of speakers, the time limit may be reduced to 1 minute.
- A sign will be posted when 1 minute remains.
- A bell will ring when time has expired.
- At the end of the Public Comment Section, the Commission President will ask if there are any additional individuals who wish to speak. Individuals who wish to speak but did not sign up by the deadline, will be granted a maximum of one minute to make their comments.

The following items are NOT subject to Public Comment:

- All items on the Closed Session Agenda

- A sign will be posted when 1 minute remains.

- At the end of the Public Comment Section, the Commission President will ask if there are any additional individuals who wish to speak. Individuals who wish to speak but did not sign up by the deadline, will be granted a maximum of one minute to make their comments.

Item # 43 [13928] – Residential Rate Reform for Pacific Gas and Electric Company, Southern California Edison Company and San Diego Gas & Electric Company

R12-06-013 – Order Instituting Rulemaking on the Commission’s Own Motion to Conduct a Comprehensive Examination of Investor Owned Electric Utilities’ Residential Rate Structures, the Transition to Time Varying and Dynamic Rates, and Other Statutory obligations.

PROPOSED OUTCOME:

- Approves 2015 Residential Rate Reforms.
- Directs electric utilities to file default residential time of use tariffs in 2018.

SAFETY CONSIDERATIONS:

- It is the utilities’ responsibility to take all actions necessary to ensure that implementation of rate changes approved herein “...promote the safety, health, comfort, and convenience of its patrons, employees, and the public.”

ESTIMATED COST:

- The utilities’ revenue requirement will not increase as a result of this decision. However, the decision will result in increases and decreases to individual residential customers’ electricity rates and bills.

Item # 43a [13992] – COMMISSIONER FLORIO'S ALTERNATE TO ITEM 13928

R12-06-013 – Order Instituting Rulemaking on the Commission's Own Motion to Conduct a Comprehensive Examination of Investor Owned Electric Utilities' Residential Rate Structures, the Transition to Time Varying and Dynamic Rates, and Other Statutory obligations.

PROPOSED OUTCOME:

- Approves a new structure for electric rates for residential customers of Pacific Gas and Electric Company, Southern California Edison Company, and San Diego Gas & Electric Company.
- The new residential rate structure denies the utilities' requests for implementation of a monthly fixed charge, and instead establishes a rate structure that includes a minimum bill amount for all residential customers and a three-tier rate structure with higher rates for higher electricity usage.
- Complies with recent legislative mandates (AB 327) related to residential rate design, including updates to the calculation of the California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE) discount.

SAFETY CONSIDERATIONS:

- It is the utilities' responsibility to take all actions necessary to ensure that implementation of rate changes approved herein "...promote the safety, health, comfort, and convenience of its patrons, employees, and the public."

ESTIMATED COST:

- The utilities' revenue requirement will not increase as a result of this decision. However, the decision will result in increases and decreases to individual residential customers' electricity rates and bills.
